

A BLESSED ASCENSION SUNDAY TO YOU ALL!

The Ascension of Jesus into heaven is sadly one of the least celebrated and understood feasts in the Church. It was only through my seminary studies that I was able to learn the significance of the Ascension and understand why it's one of the greatest feasts the Church celebrates. The Church teaches us that the highest and most solemn feast of the Church is the Easter Triduum of Christ's Passion and Resurrection, but after that, the Ascension is on the same level of rank with feasts such as Christmas and Pentecost. This may sound surprising because it may seem to some that at the Ascension Jesus just departs

from this earth so that we (the Church) can carry on the message of the Gospel to the rest of the world. However, the Ascension is much deeper and profound than this. The Ascension, in the words of Fr. Jean Corbon, is "progressive 'until we all form the perfect Man fully mature with the fullness of Christ himself' (Eph, 4:13). The movement of the Ascension will be complete only when all the members of his body have been drawn to the Father and brought to life by his Spirit' (*The Wellspring of Worship*). Hence, the Ascension is an event for us Christians because it is through the union of Jesus Christ with God the Father in heaven that we are able to be united with Christ in the liturgy that we celebrate each Sunday at Mass.

The only reason our liturgy at Mass is meaningful and sanctifying is because it participates in the liturgy that is happening in heaven. Jesus, because he became man, has now taken our humanity into heaven with himself and joined it with his Father. This union of Christ and his humanity with God the Father has now become the font or source by which mankind receives God's saving grace through each Sacrament and especially through Holy Communion. For this reason, we celebrate the Ascension not because it's the end of Jesus' earthly life, but because it's an event for every Christian who is called to ascend to the Father through union with Jesus Christ. As Fr. Corbon puts it, "the heavenly liturgy celebrates the ongoing event of the return of the Son — and of all others in him — to the Father's house" (*The Wellspring of Worship*). When Jesus became man, he and the rest of humanity have mysteriously become united into one. So now when Jesus ascends to his Father, they together have become the source of salvation through which each Christian can ascend to the Father through the power of the Holy Spirit.

During the month of May, we as Catholics traditionally honor Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth. To celebrate Mary's devotion to Christ, we






